From the HOA President:

The treasurer's report at the April 21 Silverlakes Board of Directors meeting shows the HOA operating under budget for the first time in 2021 — in spite of the fact that quite a number of first-quarter and second-quarter dues have not been paid. Late fees will be imposed on the delinquencies.

The number of delinquencies is disturbing since the board gave homeowners the entire first quarter to get their accounts on track with the bank used by our new management company. There were no fees of any kind assessed during the transition from Alliant to Compass Rose. The board sincerely hopes these accounts will be brought up to date as soon as possible.

As some of you already know, as of April 1, the old black clickers no longer open the gates. This also applies to programmable push buttons in newer cars that opened the gates, as well as the universal four-digit code, 3161.

Now that all the windshield RFID stickers have been issued, the only other way to open the gates is by using the five-digit number on the back of your proxy key card and adding a zero to it. The new gate call box accepts only six digits. Once you enter those numbers, the lower right button should turn green, and pressing it will open the gates. If you have relatives or friends coming to visit, they can still enter the old three-digit code into the call box to call your phone— if you or they still remember it. After answering your phone and identifying the caller, you can press 99* to open the gates.

All the old four-digit codes, like those used by contractors, landscapers, realtors, etc., still work but two zero's (00) must be added to the end of the old numbers to make the required six numbers. Then the lower right button should turn green, and pressing it will open the gates.

The board also rejected a proposal to replace the current white mailboxes with black metal mailboxes and posts like the one displayed for the last several months at the clubhouse.

The issue has been brought up before and, by overwhelming margins, was voted down by homeowners in proxy votes on three different occasions. The board has decided to honor the community's desires by not adopting this proposal.

The Florida Legislature has, in past years, always updated the statutes governing the many different communities here in Florida. In the past, they have concentrated mainly on the condo and co-op communities and have left the HOA communities relatively alone.

I understand that this year's session has made some changes to the HOA statute, FS720. From what I know, most of their revisions have dealt with rentals, which our HOA has already addressed. If you'd like to know more information, just search for FS720 for the year 2020 and you'll probably get more information than you may want.
