From the HOA President:

The first board meeting on Aug 17 after a two-month hiatus saw the HOA's finances doing quite well.

As of the end of July, we were under budget by \$10,642. The only category in which we were above budget was utilities, over which we have very little control.

In addition, we have received funds from several accounts that were overdue, and another "check in the mail" will reduce our outstanding fees even more. My thanks to our treasurer and secretary, Catherine LeGendre and Jim Wisniewski, for keeping close tabs on these accounts.

Our treasurer and the finance committee have begun to work on the 2023 budget. There will be meetings in the near future leading to finalization of the 2023 spending plan at the November board meeting.

A subject that has been discussed for a number of years is the poor acoustics in the clubhouse's main room. Several volunteers have formed an ad hoc committee that is doing very good work on this. They are showing us several things we can do to help reduce the echo in the room. We also have members of our community who have worked with such things in the past and have made very good suggestions. The work on all this is on-going.

Before any acoustic applications are made to the room, I want to have the room painted. I have asked the social and vendor oversight committees to develop several proposals as to the base and trim colors for the room.

Those proposals can be displayed similarly to how members of the community decided on exterior paint colors for the clubhouse. There should be a display of those various suggestions for the membership to vote on in the future. More work is to be done on this, but there is progress being made. My thanks to all those volunteers for all the work they've done and will do on all this. More info to come.

The board also is working on repairs to street gutters that are cracked and others that have water standing in them. We're getting to the point where we can start some construction soon. Obviously, there's more info to come.

Another issue being worked on is tree branches overhanging our streets. It has come to the attention of the HOA that it is our responsibility to maintain a 13.6-foot clearance from the road surface to the lowest tree branches, and the board will tackle that in the future. Any homeowner who has a tree on his property with branches lower than 13.6 feet from the road will be given the opportunity to be present when the trimming is done.

Several of our fountains and control boxes are malfunctioning, and the Vendor Oversight Committee is looking into getting those repaired. Seems nothing ever lasts forever.

As always, I want to thank all our board and committee members for all they do for our community. Without all these volunteers, Silverlakes would not look as good as it does.
