## Meet The Neighbors

## A Spotlight on Community Connections

George and Kathy Grall combine their mutual lifelong love of nature and George's skills as a National Geographic photographer to educate millions, including readers of countless magazines and newspapers.

The Gralls shared some of the local photos they've taken with a crowd that filled the Silverlakes clubhouse on Jan. 26, and are hoping to do more presentations in Lee County and beyond.

The couple, who moved to Florida from Baltimore 10 years ago, head out to remote areas every morning to find and photograph wildlife. In Lee County alone, George has photographed such birds as eagles, kites, spoonbills, limpkins, warblers, meadow larks, glossy ibis, pelicans and storks, as well as invasive animals like veiled chameleons, African Agama lizards and huge Cuban anoles. He's still on the lookout for the elusive python, a predator that has decimated the Everglades, but he was lucky enough to spot a mother panther and her cubs not far from Gateway.

A love of nature came early for both of them. George, who admits he's "been into snakes" since he was 3 years old, often brought them home, and he and his mother enjoyed turtles so much they created a habitat for them in their backyard. A self-taught photographer, he traded his first Brownie camera for a 35-mm when he was 16. He has continued to add to his equipment, which includes macro lenses to capture the tiniest of insects and underwater cameras to photograph the creatures of the sea.





While working full-time at the National Aquarium in Baltimore as a full-time staff photographer, he regularly submitted photos to a variety of magazines and was rewarded in July 1992 with a 25-page spread in National Geographic featuring the ecosystem thriving on a wharf piling in the Chesapeake Bay. Since then, his work has appeared six more times in the National Geographic, one of the most respected national magazines. His topics included Cuatro Cientages: Mexico's Desert Wetlands, snapping turtles, the life of sea horses, vernal rain pools, frogs and West Coast tide pools.

Kathy, a graphic designer who worked for the federal government at the Social Security Administration for 43 years before retiring, has always loved insects and lizards. Apparently, they love her, too. "I call her the lizard whisperer," George says, noting it's not uncommon to find her covered with little creatures who apparently are drawn to her voice and her movements.





The two met when Kathy became a volunteer at the National Aquarium where George worked, and the pair have been married for 35 years. It's a great combination. Kathy, who retired as head of the SSA's graphics department, uses those skills to organize the 5 million wildlife images in his portfolio and create all the presentations, which take months to put together.

Since moving to Florida, they've gone on photo excursions all over the state, and George's work for National Geographic magazine has taken him all over the world.

Along the way, he enjoyed what he calls his "15 minutes of fame." His spread on Cuatro Cienega drew such attention that the president of Mexico set aside 84,347 hectares (325 square miles) of land as a federally protected biological preserve. George's photographic images remain on display today in a special exhibit open to the public.
