From the HOA President:

In keeping with the Silverlakes-Gateway HOA Board of Directors' commitment to open and honest communication with the membership, I offer the following comments on the Jan. 18 board meeting:

The year 2016 ended with our spending under budget by 5.7percent. Our operating and reserve accounts remain, as a chief financial officer has stated, "healthy."

There are still 27 outstanding accounts with one account representing 65 percent of all the outstanding debt. The board remains diligent in its efforts to lower the number of those accounts.

There was an overspending of the Villa ground expenses by \$939 in 2016. That amount will be repaid to the HOA operating account by a transfer from the Villas equity account, negating a need for a special assessment to Villa owners. The Villa equity account still remains in good shape.

Several Architectural Control Committee members have produced samples of roof tile together with wall and trim paint color suggestions for the clubhouse. They are on display in the clubhouse for viewing and voting. The colors chosen will be used on the clubhouse and gatehouse roof, walls and trim. All interested residents are encouraged to cast their votes. A message has been sent out with the viewing times.

The social committee put on 30 events over the past 13 months. Members were able to hold those events without exceeding their budget while having \$130 left over to start this year's activities. The first event for 2017 was a very nice catered Chinese dinner. The next event will be a community breakfast on Saturday, Feb. 4. Thanks to all the Social Committee members for all they do for Silverlakes residents.

The exercise room has had two new floor fans added, replacing the existing fans that have been there for going on 13 years.

At the suggestion of our gate vendor, Main Gate, the Vendor Oversight Committee has had Safety Signal Systems install a new camera focusing on our entry call box. We now have 12 new digital cameras monitoring our common areas for your safety.

Steve Dobson has stepped up to monitor the clubhouse lighting, and any bulbs needing replacement will be LED bulbs. Steve also is monitoring the pool area. If there are any questions concerning the pool area as well as the water temperature, please contact Steve. Thanks, Steve! Florida Power and Light has repaired the malfunctioning streetlight near our entrance.

Since our last meeting in November, our management company, Alliant, has received 160 phone calls concerning our community. All have been resolved.

Also, since our last meeting in November, our CAM, Tabatha Robinson, has sent out 32 first letters and 19 second letters. The board agreed to send out eight fine letters. It was suggested, and the board agreed, that when any second letters are sent out, they be accompanied by a photo of the violation.

Our new website, www.silverlakes-gateway-hoa.com is up and running. Please make sure this address is entered into your address bar, not your search bar, when accessing. There is no need to register to view the majority of the postings on this website. There are two areas requiring registration to access. Just enter your last name and the first five numbers on the back of your key card.

Speaking of key cards, an increasing number of people under the age of 18 have been observed using the gym without adult supervision. Their parents have been or will be notified. If this continues, their key cards will be turned off. Parents, PLEASE comply with our regulations.

Our annual membership meeting is coming up in March. There will be one position open on the board. I'm on bended knees once again asking for anyone to consider volunteering to be on our board or on one of our committees. It is a very rewarding endeavor, which helps keep our community running smoothly while meeting some of our new neighbors. Just contact any board member to help out.

Once again, I want to thank ALL committee and board members for all they do for Silverlakes. Our next board meeting will be the day after Valentine's Day, Feb. 15. I hope everyone had an enjoyable and safe holiday season, and I would like to wish all Silverlakes residents a very Happy New Year.
