A message from our president, Lauren "Bird" Siegel, for the HOA Board of Directors:

We now have a nice flat parking lot at our clubhouse, thanks to recently completed work authorized by the board.

At the Oct. 17 meeting, I reported that tree roots were removed, a large (about 10-by-12 inch) trench was filled with concrete and the brick pavers were put back in place. The roots had caused some of the bricks to heave, causing a trip hazard.

The new trench will block the roots from raising the pavers for many years to come, and the bonus is that the work was completed without the loss of any parking spaces.

In addition, the four oak trees have been trimmed to reduce the size of their canopies.

The board thanks residents for their patience during the construction.

The board noted that the social committee has hosted 20 functions since the first of the year. I think everyone appreciates all the committee and its members do for our community. Our thanks to all of them. I certainly enjoy the events.
